Keeping and retaining teachers is top of mind right now, and this term, our teachers will also be meeting to consider a pay offer - and assessing if it's enough to make sure that teaching is valued and is an attractive profession.

That is why teachers at our school will be attending paid union meetings on Wednesday 1 March at 1.30pm. We will finish our school day at 1pm, but we will be able to provide supervision for students who can not go home early on this day.
