SPECIALIST TEACHING PROGRAMME

Intermediate School is a transition phase of schooling between Primary and Secondary School. During this time students experience rapid growth and change. It is a time to discover gifts, talents and abilities that they might foster as they develop and grow.

Part of a good, well-rounded Intermediate School programme of learning is the Specialist Teaching Programme. In the past this might have been called "Tech" and was focussed on things like Metal Work, Wood Work, Cooking and Sewing. In our school we have prioritised the Technology and Arts Curriculums for our Specialist Programme. In Terms One and Two all students will experience Specialist Teaching in Visual Art and Food Technology.

We are fortunate to have two exceptional teachers in our Specialist Teaching Team, Ms Pollak in Technology and Ms Botica in The Arts. These photos show students in action in our Art and Food Tech classrooms.

Currently in Visual Art students are learning a range of drawing and painting techniques. In Food Technology students are learning about foods from different cultures, incorporating a range of different preparation, cooking and hygiene skills.
