# Achievement Snapshot 2023


Expected achievement for Year 7 is to be working towards Level 4 of the New Zealand Curriculum, and for Year 8 to be working at Level 4 of the New Zealand Curriculum.

We acknowledge that the majority of our ākonga are not yet achieving the expected level, however we are incredibly proud of the accelerated progress our ākonga have made during 2023.

72% of our ākonga have made accelerated progress in Mathematics, 60% have made accelerated progress in Reading and 57% of our ākonga have made accelerated progress in Writing.






